Room 5 have been busy practicing their performance for Wakikirri on Wednesday night. Their interpretation of the Peter Pan and Neverland story has been a student driven process from the first day. The students have worked together to develop the story, choreography and design whole performance. With support from Ann Langman, they have produced a fantastic performance. Well done to all of the students involved!

Over the next week our Year 3, 5 & 7 students will be taking part in a NAPLAN Online trial. This is a modified version of the assessment that aims to ensure that our IT infrastructure is able to handle the number of students who will be taking part in the future. It is also an important process as we are able to provide feedback to the developers about how to make it more efficient for our students. The data collected from this assessment is not provided to us and won't be sent home. NAPLAN results from the paper based assessment taken earlier this year should be available in the next few weeks.

Last week the 8 Students Executives had a special excursion to Parliament House. As leaders of our School's Student Parliament we felt that it was a great experience for the



Student Executives to see how our State Parliament operates. We first went on a comprehensive tour of Parliament House, including the Parliament library, the Upper House and the Lower House and Old Parliament House. We learnt about the process of passing a Bill through Parliament, why the MPs sit on different side of the Chamber and the role of the

Speaker. The students then sat in on some of Question Time in the Upper House where they were excited to see some heated debate about Park Rangers! We finished off the visit by dropping in on Question Time in the Lower House where the Premier, the Ministers and MPs were also having a robust debate! It was a great afternoon and the students loved the experience.

History-Ancient Egypt

Science-Earthquakes

Jaime: Earthquakes that happen in the sea can cause tsunamis.

Jasmin: Did you know that an earthquake is caused by tectonic plates colliding under the earth's surface? Edie: Tectonic plates move and it makes the earthquake happen by two rocks scraping up against each other. Jonah: There are over 1 million earthquakes every year but only 10,000 of them are felt by other people

Callum: Did you know that tectonic plates are underneath the earth's crust?

Luke: Did you know that once an earthquake occurs sometimes small ruptures called aftershocks happen?

Marvin: I have learnt how scientists measure earthquakes with the Richter scale.



Geography- Water in the World

Sam: Did you know only 3 percent out of all the water in the world is fresh and only 1 percent is accessible?

Tom: Did you know more water flows down in the Amazon river in a day than the Murray river in a year?

Peter: Did you know that you, me and every other human being on the planet is about 60% water by weight?

Zoe: Did you know that only 3% of all the water in the world is clean and fresh and only 1% is accessible as the rest is frozen in glaciers?

Sophie: Did you know that the native fish population in the Murray Darling Basin has declined 90 percent post European arrival?

Tilly: Did you know that the water you drink is actually from a river, lake, ocean, a stream, a well or even the sky?

Sophie: Did you know that our water comes from the Murray Darling basin?


